Restructuring National Youth Festival (RNYF)

Introduction:

The National Youth Festival is an annual event organized by Department of Youth Affairs, Government of India in collaboration with one of the State Government which hosts the National Youth Festival

Over the years, the festival has become an important platform for young people from all parts of the country to showcase their talents, exchange ideas and engage in various cultural, social and sports

During the year 1995, the year when National Youth Festival was organized for the first time, the main programme components were - (1) Competitive Events (2) Non-Competitive Events (3) Yuva Kriti (4) Suvichar (5) Food Festival (6) Young Artists Camp and (7) Adventure Camp.

Need for Restructuring -

In recent times, there has been a growing demand for the restructuring of the National Youth Festival to make it more diverse, and relevant to the needs and aspirations of young people in India.

To ensure that the festival remains relevant and effective, it is necessary to periodically review and restructure its organization and programming. This can involve changes to the festival's theme, format, activities, and outreach strategies.

Proposed Changes -

1. Competitive Events – In the 26th national Youth Festival the Competitive Events has been reduced to 2 i.e., Group Folk Dance and Folk Song. To broaden the outreach of the competitive events, it is proposed to include Solo Folk Dance and Folk Song too.

- 2. Identification of Themes The identification of themes for National Youth Festival is important because it will provide a framework for the event and help to create a cohesive and memorable experience for all stakeholders. All non-competitive events during the National Youth Festival can be based on these identified themes. Each state would be allocated one theme via draw of lots. The proposed themes for the NYF are
 - a) Empowering Youth Through Entrepreneurship
 - b) Digital India
 - c) Science and Technology for Society
 - d) Health and Fitness

3. Identification of Activities - The scope of the events needs to be broadened by including more events and leaned on the above themes. The activities shall be divided into two categories - Group and Individual. Each state will select the participant for these events through competitions.

On the above referred two categories and on identified themes following indicative activities have been identified. States are free to identify and include more activities.

For each identified activity of Group and Individual category, States should organize competitions starting from District Level and culminating at State Level. The timetable for the competitions may be shared with the Department of Youth Affairs by 30th May 2023.

4. Broadening the Scope of Yuva Kriti - The Yuva Kriti provides a unique opportunity to the young participants to understand and appreciate the handicraft of different parts of the country. It also provides a platform for direct interface with youth from all over the country.

To broaden the scope of Yuva Kriti in addition to Handicrafts, Textile and Agri Products may also be included. For the Textile and Agri products the concerned State Govt may select the stalls to display in consultation with NYKS. The selection of the best stalls and best products should be done through the district and state level competitions which is to be completed before 30th September 2023.

The entries for the competitions may be invited/posted through the upcoming Yuva Portal.

5. Need for fixed yearly calendar of National Youth Festival -

There should be a fixed yearly calendar of the National Youth Festival along with various stages with dates and given timelines. As the National Youth Festival is routine flagship programme of Deptt. of Youth Affairs, fixed yearly calendar will enable all stakeholders namely Deptt. of Youth Affairs, State Govts., NYKS and NSS and other stakeholders to make necessary preparations well in advance.
